WHO:Junior and some Senior StudentsWHAT:SAT and ISA Testing

Parents and Guardians:

All 11th Grade students are required to take the SAT on April 13, 2021; additionally, all 11th Grade students are required to take the Illinois Science Assessment (ISA) on April 14, 2021. **Please note that, pursuant to Section 2-3.64a-5 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes, the SAT is a graduation requirement for 11th Grade students.** Any 12th Grade students who did not take the SAT in October are recommended to test on April 13, 2021, but they are not required to do so in order to graduate.

All testing students should report to their schools by 8:00am on testing days. Morning busses will run their usual routes with pickup times adjusted for the earlier start time.

Grade 9 and Grade 10 students will not attend school virtually or in-person on April 13 or April 14--these will be independent learning days for these students.

Please note: Students who receive timing accommodations on either of the tests will have dismissal times that vary from the above—some accommodated students will complete testing after 1:30pm. Some accommodated students will take the ISA on April 21, 2021--these students and their families will be contacted by their buildings. Please contact your student's counselor for more specific information.

For SAT testing on April 13, 2021, students should bring several #2 pencils and their calculators but should leave their cell phones, iPads, and any other electronic devices at home.

For ISA testing on April 14, 2021, students should bring their iPads fully-charged but should leave their cell phones and any other devices at home.

Testing on both days will be conducted with strict adherence to COVID guidance from the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) and the Cook County Department of Public Health (CCDPH) including masking, social distancing, and enhanced cleaning and sterilization. Completed self-certification forms are required for students on both days. Students who refuse to wear masks or to maintain social distance will be removed from testing and their scores will be voided.
